2.	What is one area in which you think your program could improve beliefs or actions related to family-centered practice? Think about: a. Do you reach <i>all</i> families?

	c. Do families feel connected to the program? Do they consider it a resource and an asset for the community?
3.	How does your program engage families? What strategies do you use?
4.	Where could you go to get new ideas?
5.	Describe the struggles you see staff members having with families. How do you support staff <i>and</i> families?
6.	What tensions do you feel in your role? Whom can you talk to about these tensions? Do you feel supported in your role?
